ICF Project Description (brief description using theory of change model):

1 - What is the problem you are trying to solve?

As part of the WWCDG work on joint commissioning, a review of respite provision is being undertaken in 2018/2019. The review is considering existing respite support and provision across the region, considering what works well and determining future opportunities and new ways of working. In particular the review is seeking to generate proposals to create carer led co-production service specifications for future commissioning models. This funding will support the implementation of recommendations. It is anticipated that this will include co-production with carers, development of information resources and further work to develop future commissioning intentions. It is anticipated that the next stage of regional commissioning review will consider Young Carers and Young Adult Carers.

2 - What long term outcome/change are you hoping to achieve?

WWCDG is seeking to develop more efficient regional commissioning where the drivers for respite support are more closely aligned to the determined needs of Carers and the Cared for. The project will seek to deliver an extended respite and respite offer and develop partnership commissioning arrangements and implement the recommendations of the University of Swansea review

3 - Who is your key audience?

Commissioners, Carers, Service providers, Social Work professionals, Emerging Social Tourism Networks and wider respite projects.

4 - How will you reach them? The project will use existing and developing networks to promote outcomes of the review

5 – What resources are available to support? WWCDG Officers core resources, commissioned carers services and the newly formed Short Breaks and Social Tourism Practice and Research Network

6 - What activities will bring about the change? Change will be embedded through training, wider exchange of information through new networks, promotion of renewed opportunities and links to proposed web based tools
