Regional Capacity

ICF Project Description (brief description using theory of change model):

1 - What is the problem you are trying to solve?

This project will provide capacity to undertake reviews of individuals with a Learning Disability currently placed in residential care. The reviews will be undertaken jointly with the Health Board to identify if individuals are appropriately supported and should have the opportunity to progress into more independent living options. The additional capacity will also allow progress of options in a more timely way. This project will align with the ICF capital community living project by identifying potential individuals requiring accommodation and matching them to appropriate supported living options developed via the capital project. The reviews will also assist in identifying future need on an individual and strategic basis to inform service development.

2 - What long term outcome/change are you hoping to achieve?

Individuals with a learning disability live within their own communities in accommodation that is appropriately supported for their needs, but promotes their independence and builds on their strengths

3 - Who is your key audience?

Individuals with a Learning Disability or a dual LD/MH diagnosis who are: living in residential care, completing residential college courses, working towards more independent living e.g. leaving family home, living in supported tenancies away from their community.

4 - How will you reach them?

Ceredigion County Council currently funds 58 people with LD in residential settings, 27 jointly with health. 39 with a MH diagnosis, 31 jointly with health. In addition there are 6 LD placements in supported tenancies out of county, 5 jointly funded with health and 7 placements in supported tenancies out of county with a MH diagnosis, 6 jointly funded with health. Joint funded placements will require input from both funding partners to progress any change.

Others will be reached through our Community Team Learning Disabilities, including our transition workers.

5 - What resources are available to support?

The Community Team Learning Disabilities has limited capacity to undertake these more in depth reviews and provide the additional support required, but existing resources will enable induction and supervision of staff to undertake the role, including administrative resources. The team will work closely with the local Health Board.

6 - What activities will bring about the change?

Recruitment of 2 x Senior Practitioner Social Workers £ 93,712.00 to undertake reviews and support the progression process.

How does your project address your population needs assessment and area plan?

There is currently a lack of opportunity for individuals with LD/ MH diagnosis or a dual diagnosis to reside within their own communities or to progress towards increased independence. This was evidence as a need during public engagements to update our Learning Disabilities Strategy by individuals with a learning disability, their families and carers, provider agencies.
